The EDDT is the first instrument to provide a standardized approach to the assessment of Emotional Disturbance (ED). It is useful for school psychologists, counseling/clinical psychologists, guidance counselors, evaluation specialists, teachers, educational diagnosticians, and speech/language pathologists within the school setting, as well as within juvenile correctional facilities.

Children who are socially maladjusted do not meet the criteria for special education services for an ED, unless deemed both socially maladjusted and emotionally disturbed. The EDDT treats social maladjustment (SM) as a supplemental trait, and assesses it after ED characteristics have been assessed.

The EDDT encompasses all of the federal criteria, and addresses the broad emotional and behavioral nuances in those requiring special education services for an ED. Designed by a working school psychologist, the EDDT includes five sections that correlate with the specific components of the federal criteria, enabling evaluators to work through each criterion—one by one.

specificity=.97, ROC/AUC=.93). Confirmatory and exploratory factory analyses demonstrate the theoretical and empirical validity of the subscales.

Correlations of the GARS-3 scores with those of other well-known diagnostic tests for Autism are large, or very large, in magnitude. Test-retest (time sampling) reliability coefficients exceed .80 for subscales, and .90 for the Autism Indexes. Interrater reliability intraclass coefficients exceed .80, and .84 for the Autism Indexes. Internal consistency (content sampling) reliability coefficients for the subscales exceed .85 and the Autism Indexes exceed .93.

While the Internet is a relatively new technology, that has impacted the world, and provided many benefits, it has also had negative ramifications. Individuals unable to control their use are jeopardizing school, employment and relationships. The concept of "Internet Addiction" is use to explain uncontrollable, damaging use of technology. It is characterized as an impulse control disorder, comparable to pathological gambling, because of the overlapping diagnostic criteria and symptomatology.

The IAT and IAT-F have emerged as the first validated measures of Internet and technology addiction. They capture the problematic behavior associated with compulsive use of technology, including compulsive use of online games and social media, online gambling and porn.

The assessments can be administered in a variety of mental health settings, including private practice clinics, schools, hospitals and residential programs, as part of an intake assessment, when there is suspicion of internet addiction. They are also valuable pre-employment screening devices, to detect internet addiction among job candidates, to improve productivity and reduce corporate liability.

Based on 20 self-report items, IAT and IAT-F measure the severity of addiction, in terms of mild, moderate or severe. The IAT is a 20-item self-report instrument for adolescents and adults. The IAT-F is a 20-item assessment for children and adolescents, completed by an informant who knows the youth well. Both instruments can be used together, in assessment, to obtain a well-rounded profile of the client's social media addiction, and also to identify discrepancies amongst raters.

The SDS is a self-administered, self-scored, and self-interpreted occupational assessment to classify individuals according to six basic types:

- Realistic
- Investigative
- Artistic

- Social
- Enterprising

The theory is based upon the idea that if an individual's personality type matches the work environment, job fulfillment and career satisfaction are more likely.

The Standard SDS Assessment Booklet asks questions about aspirations, activities, competencies, and the level of interest in a variety of occupations. It asks questions, such as, "I can read blueprints", allowing the individual to rate their abilities on a scale of 1-7.

The results produce a three-letter Summary Code that helps the individual find educational, and occupational, matches to fit the personality type. These Summary Codes are linked to more than 1,400 jobs on the Occupational Information Network (O*NET). Individuals, or their career counselors, can identify careers, and programs, that are the best matches for their unique personality.

The Standard SDS uses normative data from the SDS Form R, 5th Edition (2013). It was standardized on 1,739 students and adults, ages 11-70 years. Reliability coefficients for the Activities, Competencies and Occupations scales range from .71 to .93, and summary scale coefficients range from .88 to .94. Test-retest reliability ranged from .82 to .96 on the overall sample, indicating that summary scale scores have substantial stability over time. The Standard SDS correlates significantly with three factors from the NEO Personality Inventory (Extroversion, Openness and Agreeableness) and other measures of personality, including the Career Thoughts Inventory.



Nonverbal Stroop Card Sorting Test

Two sets of cards—one with matching color bars ("color congruent") and one with non-matching color bars ("color incongruent")—to contrast the speed (cards per second) with which the individual sorts the cards onto a large laminated sheet showing locations for each color. The difference between the congruent and incongruent trials reveals the degree of Stroop interference, hence the "Stroop Effect." The effect score can then be converted to a national percentile or standard score for the examinee's age group to assess the magnitude of any unusually large difference in sorting speed, showing evidence of process deficits.

The cognitive dimension tapped by Stroop is associated with cognitive flexibility, resistance to interference from outside stimuli, creativity and psychopathology-all of which influence the individual's ability to cope with cognitive stress, and process complex output.

Since it requires only five minutes to administer, the Stroop Color and Word Test is an exceptionally useful screening instrument, which may be used alone, or as part of a larger screening battery.

EACH STROOP TEST BOOKLET CONSISTS OF THREE BASIC PARTS:

Word Page— the names of color printed in black ink.

Color Page– semantically meaningless symbols (X) printed in colored ink. **Color-Word Page**– words from the first page, printed in the colors from the

second page, with the restriction that the word and color do not match. The task is to look at each sheet, and move down the columns, reading words or naming the ink colors, as quickly as possible, within a given time limit. The test yields three scores, and Interference, based on the number of items completed.



Smell deficits are caused by a wide range of neurological, psychiatric and medical disorders. Smell loss can be an early sign of such neurological diseases as Alzheimer's and idiopathic Parkinson's disease. Early identification, in some cases, can delay the time of onset, or mitigate the degree of symptom development.

Measurement of smell function is a common problem in neurology, and other medical specialties. Many patients are unaware of any dysfunction. While 90 percent of patients with Parkinson's Disease have a demonstrable deficit, only about a quarter are aware of any problem, prior to testing. Above each odorant strip is a multiple-choice question, with four potential smell descriptions. The forced-choice test requires the individual to make one of four choices, even if no smell is perceived.

To establish the meaning of an individual's test score, it is compared to scores from normal persons of equivalent age and gender. A percentile score is established, providing an easy-to-interpret measure of performance.

Normative data has been collected from nearly 4,000 individuals of all ages. Test-retest reliability exceeds .90.



The Fuld Object-Memory Evaluation allows the examiner to evaluate memory and learning under conditions that virtually guarantee attention and minimize anxiety. It eliminates questions about the effects of poor vision, hearing, language handicaps, cultural differences or inattention because the procedure guarantees attention even under adverse testing conditions.

The test was developed with hundreds of aged adults, nursing home residents and community active people, for whom norms are provided. It has also proved easy-to-give and effective with school-age children. The blind or deaf are not at a disadvantage on this test. It appears to be relatively "culture fair," as well. Ten common objects in a bag are presented to determine whether the patient can identify objects by touch (stereognosis). The patient is not told that memory of this event will be tested. (Left and right hands are alternated systematically, providing information about the patient's left-right orientation). The patient names, or describes, each object and then pulls it out of the bag "to see if it was right." After distracting the patient, by asking the patient to say words rapidly




from a single category (rapid verbal retrieval), the patient is asked to recall the things from the bag. The patient is then offered four more chances to learn and recall them (store and retrieve) by reminding the patient of omitted items after each recall, with rapid verbal retrieval preventing rehearsal before each recall opportunity. 




